FACTS ABOUT MODESTO CITY SCHOOLS

Modesto City Schools is made up of an elementary school district (grades K-8) and a high school district (grades 9-12). Both are governed by a single, seven-member Board of Education elected at large from within the high school district attendance area – approximately 168 square miles – for four-year terms of office.

There are 23 elementary schools (grades K-6), four junior high schools (grades 7-8), six comprehensive high schools (grades 9-12), and an extensive alternative education program within Modesto City Schools. Enrollment for the 2008-2009 school year is expected to reach approximately 32,000+ students (grades K-12, plus pre-kindergarten and adult education programs).

The District's instructional program is based on continually evaluated and renewed curriculum as well as on the nationally recognized *Fourth R: Responsibility* program. The *Fourth R* promotes academic achievement, individual responsibility, respect for others, and good citizenship at school and in the larger community.
